Indicators	Measures of Success
Attendance	The TCSD has adopted its Virtual Learning Attendance Policy. This policy is in line with the Mississippi Department of Educations' Virtual Learning policy. Attendance will be checked daily in the Learning Management System (Canvas) and transferred in to SAMS and MSIS.
	Students will receive 240 minutes of instruction to include live instruction (synchronous time) and video instruction and assignments (asynchronous time).
Assignments	Students will be held accountable for the completion of all assignments. The assignments will be graded in accordance to the TCSD Grading Policy and will be reflected in daily grades, semester averages, and final grades.
	Students must have an average above 60% to gain a Carnegie credit. Students can receive grades in the following areas:  • Class assignments • Class participation and discussion boards • Quizzes

	Benchmark testing (Summative Assessments)
Class Participation & Discussion Boards	All students will be required to actively participate in class, on the discussion board. Students will receive participation points when they respond to the topic or initiate a discussion based on the content being taught or discussed.  Explanation of course work and bell-ringers will also be calculated in class participation points. The class participation and discussion board points will be reflected in daily grades.
Assessments, Presentations, Projects, and Research Papers	Student assessments such as: exit tickets, quizzes, authentic assessments, weekly assessments, unit assessments, and benchmark assessments will be given. Presentations, projects, and Research papers will also be calculated as assessments.
	All assessments will be graded and averaged. These grades will become a part of the nine weeks averages and semester averages.
